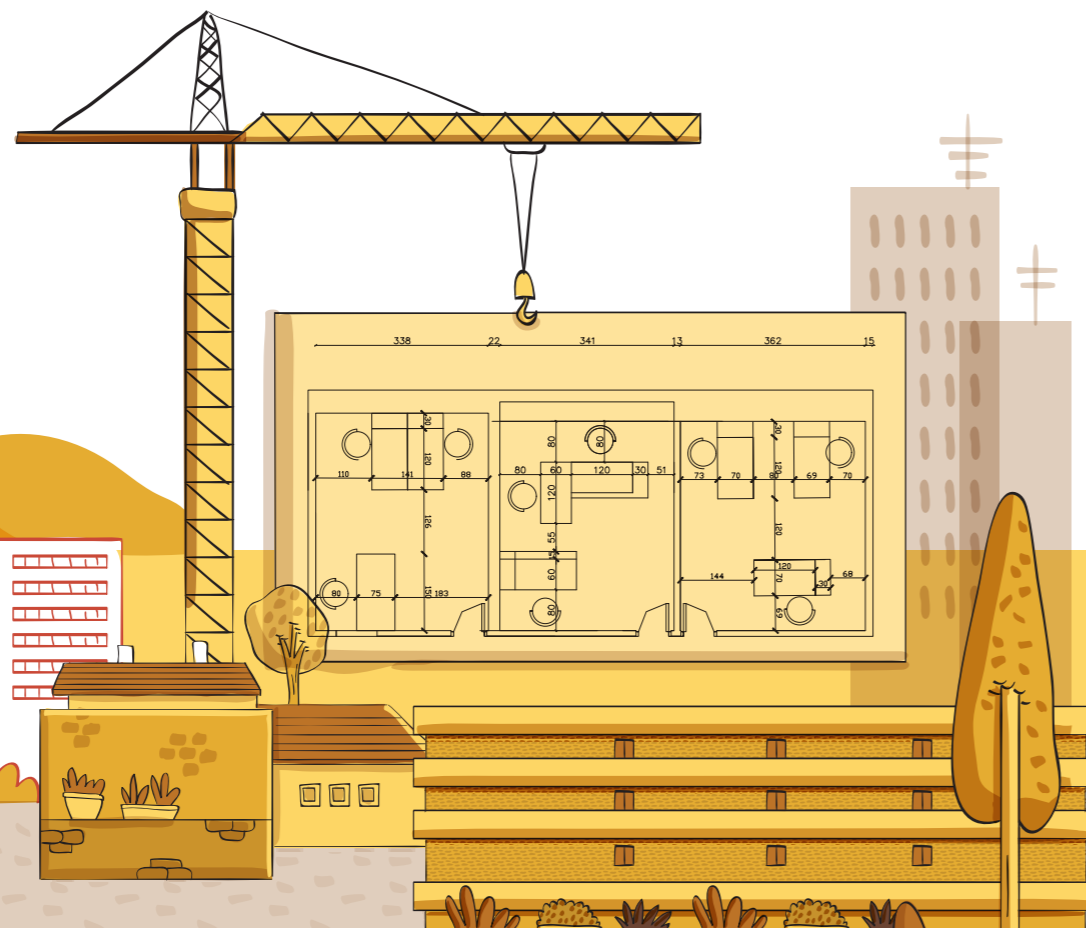

**Pooling
Resources**

The Jerusalem Center for Jewish Renaissance and Pluralism will offer organizations sharing its work space administrative and operational services, including centrally managed communications systems, and legal, accounting and administrative services. Pooling these resources will reduce overhead costs, and enable organizations to spend more time and energy advancing their missions.



**Capacity building
and professional
development**

In-house professional consultancy services will teach member organizations how to become more efficient and effective. Organizations will learn how to improve impact assessment and attain sustainability, and how to better define and articulate the singular benefit they offer, and their theory of change.



Innovation hub

Professional and lay mentors will teach resident organizations how to develop groundbreaking Jewish renaissance ideas into supportable platforms. Specialized training will guide professionals as they build up their ideas and implement them in their organizations.



Educational tourism

A variety of original tours with experiential content will be developed, to which the general public will be invited. They will encompass every one of the city's communities, and involve inter-sectoral and inter-faith dialogue.



**Community-wide
programs and events**

Educational and cultural events of up to 200 people will be held regularly, and approximately 80 training and enrichment programs and workshops will be held annually, engaging over 20,000 Jerusalem residents every year. A landscaped garden will soon be ready to host outdoor activities and community-wide events. Meetings, study sessions, trainings, presentations, and performances will be held in open spaces of varying sizes; a gallery will hold educational exhibitions.
